







My Care My Call A RESEARCH STUDY TO IMPROVE HEALTH AND FUNCTION AFTER SPINAL CORD INJURY

Am I eligible to participate?

- You may be able to take part if...
- You are an English-speaking adult who has a traumatic SCI
- Your spinal cord injury occurred over 1 year ago
- You will have access to a telephone for the next 6 months

What is the study? How does the study work?

- My Care My Call, a phone-based intervention, aims to improve the health and function of people with SCI, and reduce the proportion of people with SCI who report delays in receiving primary care due to specific barriers.
- You will not need to travel to take part in this study; you may stay in your home.
- If you choose to take part and are eligible for the study, you will be randomly assigned to either Group 1 or 2. Both groups will receive a community resource book. Only Group 2 will receive weekly to biweekly phone calls from the My Care My Call Peer Health Coach.
- You will receive \$100 for your participation for completion of the study.
